The knowledge and proficiency he learned as a heavy equipment operator became a foundation for his future self-employment, leading him into excavation within the stone quarry business and continued operation within the commercial truck industry.

Doug enjoyed spending time with his wife and children; he was a family man. He took great pride in their accomplishments. Doug held a natural athleticism

and love of baseball, golf, hunting, fishing and, all things outdoors! Oh yes, and he enjoyed the news and, he inevitably always had an opinion! The remote control was most assuredly in his possession.

He lived life on his own terms. He was deeply loved and cherished. We will never forget his long-suffering with the ongoing battle that caused relentless pain brought about from a 2017 injury involving heavy equipment.
