This skill, passed down to the next generation, is a testament to his

ingenuity. He was happy to help anyone with something that needed fixing. George's love for his family was evident in his eyes, especially when he spoke of his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He loved to dance, particularly the polka, and he and his wife could twirl around the floor with grace, even in their 80s. Back in the day, they would square dance at the fire station, a cherished tradition. He was a devoted husband throughout their long marriage. In the last 8 years, he dedicated his time to caring for his wife during her illness and being her constant companion. Our family takes great comfort in knowing they are together again dancing the polka like they are 22.
