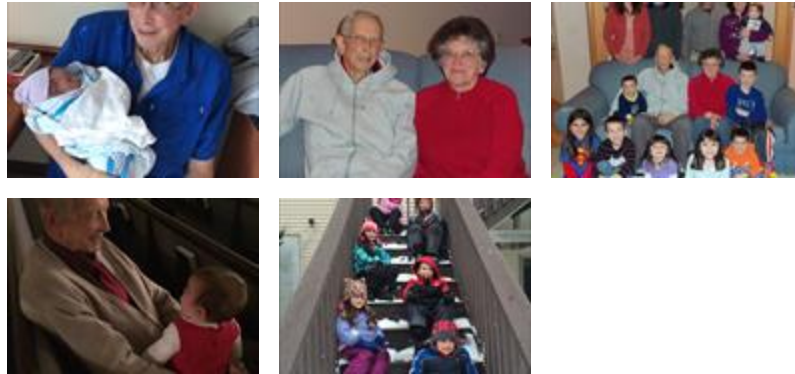

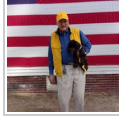

*Alison Lont Boorujy called us on Monday, March 14, 2016, about her father's entering the Presence of Jesus earlier that morning. After we talked more with her and his wife, Nancy, about the demeanor and the manner of Warren's home-going, I immediately thought of a similarity to the record of Enoch in the Bible.*

*"And Enoch walked with God: and he was not; for God took him."  
Genesis 5:24*

*"By faith Enoch...was not found...he had this testimony, that he pleased God. But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." Hebrews 11:5-6*

*I remember Warren as an upperclassman when I was a freshman. But our real friendship began when I was called to be the pastor at Thompson Baptist Church, Thompson, PA. Nancy Rinker was a member in this church. Warren's and Nancy's wedding was planned with the interim pastor, Dr. Jack Jacobs. Dr. Jacobs began his teaching at Baptist Bible Seminary, Johnson City, NY, when I was a freshman. Dr. Jacobs was a major contributor to my education since I had a number of classes with him. He advocated for me to have the opportunity to candidate at the church. He later participated in my ordination council. Warren and Nancy Lont were a great help at that event, too, and in many other ways for these 45 years. We always knew they were praying for us. Before they were married we went over to their home in Great Bend to help them. They had been remodeling a classic Victorian home and getting it ready for the wedding reception and to begin housekeeping together after they were married. This was the beginning of our projects together. Their home, O, their home. For family, friends, church members, missionaries, pastors, and all kinds of people their home was the greatest refuge for fellowship, ministry and hospitality. While we were in both Thompson and Endwell, NY, there were annual Christmas cookie and Easter candy events into the night. For Alison and Jonathan in their childhood, I was the Cookie Monster. There were exciting excursions together in church ministries, shopping and exploring. Warren and Nancy were great shoppers and givers. They found wonderful things to share with all their family and friends. Their kindness is a treasure enduring in our hearts. They have been our guests while vacationing in New England to our delight. When we have been separated by many miles there have been phone calls, cards, notes and photos of the children and grandchildren. In recent years when we were on vacation there were happy Sunday dinners around the Lont festive dining table with Pastor Earl and Mrs. Lois Grabey, Bob and Jean Samson, Warren and Nancy, and Marilyn and me. Warren would be pouring soda and scooping up the ice cream. Now Pastor, Bob and Warren are all reunited in heaven. When Marilyn's father died and more recently her mother Warren and Nancy came down from Great Bend to Berwick to help us with lots of food and to serve in putting on a buffet in our home—even to the clean-up. Two*

*years ago we were getting our home ready for a contractor to work they came down so Warren could help me move equipment in the basement. Frequently Warren would suggest to me a new way that he was using to witness to people about Jesus. Often he had a new sample of literature to give me for this purpose. When we were with them we joined them at all the services and other activities of the Hallstead Baptist Church. Every church prays to be filled with committed church members like Warren and Nancy. O, my friend, Warren, "I Saw Jesus in You."*
